### Transcription Booklet Overview

This booklet includes the transcriptions from VR elicitation that informed the EdD thesis 'What Are Students Doing When We Aren't Looking? A Hermeneutic Phenomenological Exploration of Risk Management on a Student Film Shoot'. The welcome protocol provides more context to the transcriptions.

#### Welcome Protocol

Points to cover with participant at the start of the elicitation experience Mar 2019. Duration Approx 1 hour. Allow for 2-hour time slots in the schedule.

Introduction to the space and activity

- 1. Welcome into the room.
- 2. Offer tea/coffee/biscuit/juice/water.
- 3. Brief informal chat to put at ease.
- 4. Double check gender preferences and pronouns and discussed any preferred pseudonym for the write up.
- 5. Point out video camera recording us both as well as audio recorder for close up sound.
- 6. Introduce HMD and explain how that is mirrored onto the screen that I will watch and how that plays through the speakers.
- 7. Fitting headset and adjustments.
- 8. Ask if they have any comments or questions.

Description of the structure of the elicitation to share with participant before commencement:

- Watch video 1 and have semi structured dialogue whilst watching.
- Watch video 2 and have semi structured dialogue whilst watching.
- Stop for a break. Remove HMD. Check on wellbeing.
- Look at documentation whilst having refreshments (I leave room or give space for this activity)
- Rewatch video 2 having looked at the documentation and have semi structured dialogue whilst watching.
- Watch video 3 and have semi structured dialogue whilst watching.
- Remove HMD
- Conclude elicitation and check for any general remarks or additions from the participant.

Yeah that's good. So yeah, just literally you've just come back from being immersed in that, how are you, are there any thoughts or anything now that you have been through that? Random ones, whatever.
196.	Jeff : Umm. Well obviously there's a lot to change, when you look back, but no one can really think in hindsight

197.	Researcher : Yeah no you can't.
198.	Jeff : So you kind of just have to re-watch it like now and just take it in for the next project.
199.	Researcher: Is there but, so ok, you just said to me that obviously there are things to change, so then
200.	Jeff : Yeah.
201.	Researcher: So there's things there that you would think ooh I'll think about that next time?
202.	Jeff : Yeah for next time. Yeah like I mentioned the problem of me sort of getting demotivated and everyone else getting
	demotivated, that's something I have to really work on because I can't really rely too much on the directors or the producers
	or everyone really being uplifting the whole time, I have to, I kind of just have to go through it and do the best I can.
203.	Researcher: Yeah.
204.	Jeff : And another thing because I'm not doing a big role like I will get demotivated, again something I have to work on for
	me, I can't really umm, I'm trying to change it because this has happened, like I said, in past projects, I'm trying to change
	it.
205.	Researcher: But in a way you've come in and you kind of vocalised that quite early on, so has this just reinforced that thought or
	it's that thought was there before anyway?
206.	Jeff : Oh it was there before.
207.	Researcher: So actually this is not particularly ground breaking for you?
208.	Jeff : It reinforced it for me.
209.	Researcher: Oh ok.

210.	Jeff : Yeah. I had the thought but then this kind of just made me
211.	Researcher: What seeing yourself or just seeing the environment again?
212.	Jeff : Seeing everything, just even though I don't see it on the screen I'm still reminded of what's going on.
213.	Researcher : So does it bring you back into that space?
214.	Jeff : Yeah, yeah, yeah. It brings it back.
215.	Researcher : And back into that mind-set?
216.	Jeff : Yeah. Yeah, yeah, yeah.
217.	Researcher : Did it take you back to that I'm playing the guitar in the lecture theatre mind-set?
218.	Jeff: Yeah it's not like I'm fully in that mind-set now, but I just remember what it felt like, what the mind-set was, what I was going through.
219.	Researcher : Yeah, cool ok. Are there any last things you'd like to say that you feel like you should share?
220.	Jeff : Umm, everyone did a fantastic job on set and yeah.
221.	Researcher: Yeah excellent.
